Making sure every horse has access 24/7 to fresh, clean water is a top priority. Along with high temperatures come drier fields, which can prevent horses' feet from receiving appropriate moisture to keep their hooves healthy. These hot days also mean farmers may not get a second cutting of hay, indicating we need to stock up on our winter hay supply just in case. Rest assured while many of you are spending days at the lake or relaxing by the pool we are taking this time to make sure the horses get the extra needed attention they need while preparing for their winter care.

handsome 15-year-old Quarter Horse gelding. He didn't come to us in the normal condition of most horses that pass through our barn doors. He is a part of our Foster to Adopt program that allows potential adopters to give a horse a 30 day trial before a final adoption takes place. Are you willing to give
